

Covid-19 vaccination has been rolling out globally, especially in the firstworld countries that have already started their vaccination earlier this vear. Some of the western states are almost in the light towards herd immunity. Meanwhile. in the Philippines, the first-ever vaccine received by the government is the Sinovac, donated by China.

According to Secretary Carlito Galvez Ir. the vaccine czar, it is expected that the vaccines will arrive in the country and will be distributed during the second quarter of this year. As of now, there are several vaccines delivered in the country including Pfizer, Moderna, Astrazeneca, and Johnson & Johnson.

As a pre-requisite initiative WSMSI, the management conducted an online survey through google forms to determine the employees' interest and willingness vaccinated. This is to identify the employees who are up for the vaccination if there will be equally available vaccines in the future

Furthermore, as stated by Labor Secretary Silvestre Rello employees should not be required to get vaccinated against COVID-19. He added that the DOLE will release a department order for the vaccination of employees. It will prohibit mandatory vaccination, where the employee has the right to choose whether to himself/herself get vaccinated or not

The management of WSMSI, however, has been continuously exerting efforts to encourage their employees to get vaccinated, since it is the only way to help achieve the herd immunity of the country. More than anything else, to get vaccinated is to protect vourself, your family, your workmates, and the people around vou.

COVID-19 can spread quickly and widely. It has resulted in the deaths of over 1.9 million people worldwide and over 900 deaths in Australia.

When enough people in the community are vaccinated, it slows down the spread of disease.

Achieving herd immunity is a long-term goal. It usually requires a large amount of the population to be vaccinated.

For this reason, public health practices will stay in place until evidence shows that:

- vaccination prevents transmission and
- herd immunity is achieved in Australia.
 The best strategy to manage the potential public health risk posed by incoming travelers to is mandatory quarantine with regular COVID-10 testing.

Safety Tips while Working in the Heat

Knowing how to work safely in hot weather can help prevent heat stress injuries and heat stroke. According to the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), heat stroke is the most serious heat-related disorder and occurs when the body can no longer control its temperature. Other heat-related disorders include heat exhaustion, heat cramps and heat rash.

Ten Hot Weather Safety Tips:

- 1.Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of fluids; drink about 16 ounces before starting and 5 to 7 ounces every 15 or 20 minutes.
- Avoid dehydrating liquids. Alcohol, coffee, tea and caffeinated soft drinks can hurt more than help.
- 3. Wear protective clothing. Lightweight, light-colored and loose-fitting clothing helps protect against heat. Change clothing if it gets completely saturated.
- 4. Pace yourself. Slow down and work at an even pace. Know your own limits and ability to work safely in heat.
- 5. Schedule frequent breaks. Take time for rest periods and water breaks in a shaded or air conditioned area.
- 6.Use a damp rag. Wipe your face or put it around your neck.
- 7.Avoid getting sunburn. Use sunscreen and wear a hat if working outside.
- 8.Be alert to signs of heat-related illness. Know what to look for and check on other workers that might be at high risk.
- 9. Avoid direct sun. Find shade or block out the sun if possible.
- 10. Eat smaller meals. Eat fruits high in fiber and natural juice. Avoid high protein foods.



Heat stroke occurs when the body no longer sweats and body temperature reaches dangerous levels. Symptoms of heat stroke include:

- · Dry, hot reddish skin and lack of sweating
- · High body temperature
- · Strong, rapid pulse
- Chills
- ConfusionSlurred speech

Heat exhaustion is the body's response to the loss of water and salt, typically through sweating.

- Symptoms of heat exhaustion include:
- · Excessive sweating
- Weakness or fatigue
- Dizziness and/or confusion
- Clammy skin
- Muscle cramps
- · Flushed complexion

Heat cramps are painful cramps in the body's muscles due to low salt levels and are typically caused by excessive sweating. Symptoms of heat cramps include:

- Muscle pain usually in the abdomen, arm or legs
- Muscle spasms usually in the abdomen, arm or legs.

Heat Rash is an irritation of the skin caused by excessive sweating. Symptoms of heat rash include:

- Red cluster of pimples or small blisters
- Usually on neck and upper chest, groin area, under the breasts, and in elbow creases.

If I were to say, That I couldn't speak, Would you take advantage of me? Break my soul, make me weak?


